Asking the Right Questions: APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask Program

Asking the right questions provides valuable information for career decisions. As part of the APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask (JCQ) Program participating political science departments have agreed to answer the following questions from job candidates.

Salary

- 1. What is the salary structure?
- 2. How is salary normally negotiated?
- 3. How are annual increases handled?
- 4. Is there an automatic escalator to ensure the salaries of future hires will not outpace those of existing department members?

Service Activities

- 1. What are the expectations of pre-tenure and tenured faculty regarding:
 - departmental and institutional committee work,
 - professional or disciplinary activities, and
 - outreach activities to communities external to institution?

Research Support

- 1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - access to research materials and equipment,
 - the employment of research assistants,
 - · research expenses on/off campus, and
 - travel expenses for conferences?

2. What departmental or institutional resources are available to seek external funding and to administer external funding awards?

Teaching Support

- 1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - the development of teaching expertise,
 - · innovations in teaching, and
 - the introduction of new courses and new technologies?
- 2. What are departmental expectations regarding:
 - the average course load,
 - the number of different courses taught by faculty, and
 - advising of graduate and undergraduate students?

Tenure, Renewal, and Annual Review

- 1. What policies and procedures govern the granting of tenure, renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty, and annual reviews of faculty performance?
- 2. What are the department's expectations for successful performance leading to the granting of tenure or renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty?
- 3. What are the department's expectations for a positive annual review?

Mentoring and Faculty Support Initiatives

- 1. What attention does the department give to integrating new faculty into the department, the institution, and in the profession?
- 2. Does the department or institution have programs that address:
 - the employment of dual-career professional couples,
 - family needs of faculty and staff, and
 - issues associated with minority faculty and staff?

Health and Life Insurance

- 1. What are the plans offered?
- 2. How are benefits disbursed?
- 3. What are the out-of-pocket expenses?
- 4. Are partners and/or children covered, and to what extent?
- 5. What portion of my paycheck will be deducted for these benefits?

Retirement

- 1. How many types of retirement plans are offered?
- 2. What is the matching percentage of the institution?
- 3. Is contribution required (and how much)?

Duties

The University of Pennsylvania seeks an innovative, collaborative and visionary leader to direct the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Paideia Program (Paideia). Paideia is an exciting new five-year pilot program envisioned to be Penn's central hub for educating undergraduates to be informed, engaged and effective citizens, civic leaders, and productive members of the local, national and global communities of which they are a part. From their first year on campus through their senior year, Penn students will actively engage in bridging social, cultural,

economic and political divides through a combination of broad-based classroom education in civic discourse and deliberation, community-based research and engagement, and a wide array of additional co-curricular experiences. As currently conceived, Paideia would engage large numbers of Penn undergraduates (who total just over 10,000) in a robust civic education, while also providing a more structured experience for smaller cohorts of student leaders (Paideia Fellows). It will build on, collaborate with, and leverage existing programs and organizations at Penn to make the Paideia Program – and the Penn experience – far greater, and more meaningful, than the sum of its individual parts.

Working with Paideia's Faculty Director, the Executive Director would have primary responsibility for all aspects of the program's design and implementation, including, but not limited to, outreach to Penn students, faculty and staff, designed to integrate the ethic and practice of effective civic engagement across the University. Specific duties will include: identifying, networking, and coordinating with existing Penn programs and centers; forming an advisory board; developing and overseeing four new Paideia courses a year over three years and recruiting faculty to teach courses; identifying and shepherding cohorts of up to 20 students per class to serve as Paideia Fellows; management of the day-to-day operations, including hiring and supervising staff; oversee budget; oversee design and content of website; and teach up to two Paideia courses a year.

Description

The Social Science Research Council (SSRC) is a Brooklyn, NY–based, independent, international, nonprofit organization devoted to the advancement of interdisciplinary research in the social sciences through a wide variety of workshops and conferences, fellowships and grants, summer training institutes, scholarly exchanges, research, and publications. The SSRC seeks to hire a Program Officer to support its work in understanding and addressing the contemporary challenges facing

democracy in the United States and around the world. The principal responsibility of the position is to manage, in partnership with the Vice President of Programs, the Anxieties of Democracy (AOD) program, to contribute to the development of democracy-related programming at the SSRC, and to support other relevant aspects of the SSRC's work.

The AOD program is motivated by a concern about whether the core institutions of representative democracies can capably address large problems in the public interest. The program promotes research and dialogue on a range of topics related to democratic functioning—for example, asking how democracies can effectively respond to climate change, deal with challenges to national security, and address the political consequences of a changing economy. With the support of the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation and others, the Anxieties of Democracy program aims to mobilize existing research; promote new research; publish and disseminate findings; forge pathways for bringing this knowledge to policy, media, and public audiences; and provide opportunities for new generations of social scientists to address how democracies could govern more effectively. It pursues these goals in consultation with the AOD advisory committee and through a set of activities that includes topically focused working groups, conferences and workshops, a book series in partnership with a major university press, the Democracy Papers blog, and a range of outreach and public engagement activities.

The Program Officer will oversee the day-to-day implementation of this work while participating in the design and development of new activities related to the state of contemporary democracy, including the preparation of new funding proposals. In addition, the Program Officer will collaborate with SSRC colleagues in related programs on the impact of media on politics (including the Media and Democracy program and the Disinformation Research Mapping Initiative) and other areas of work concerned with political participation and public policy.

This is a one-year position, with the potential of renewal based on availability of funding.

Responsibilities:

In partnership with the Vice President of Programs and other colleagues, the Program Officer will:

manage the implementation and further development of the Anxieties of Democracy program, including the development of funding proposals to support program activities;

with the program's advisory committee and SSRC leadership, develop new program directions and conduct oversight of program activities, engage with program funders, and produce reports on program progress;

oversee planning for upcoming events, including conferences, workshops, and working group meetings, as well as manage program budgets;

with the series editors, steer publications for the Anxieties of Democracy book series and serve as managing editor for the Democracy Papers essay series; oversee other program publications as well as the program's online and social media presence;

facilitate connections between scholars and relevant policy and media communities in order to shape broader public debate on how to

improve the problem-solving capacities of representative democratic institutions; and

liaise and coordinate with various organizational partners on aspects of program implementation.

Other responsibilities:

with the Vice President of Programs and other colleagues, collaborate in developing new projects and programs related to the Program Officer's areas of expertise and interest, supporting the development of new funding proposals in these areas as needed; and handle additional responsibilities and projects as directed, depending on interest and capacity.

Qualifications:

PhD in a social science or closely related field (including but not limited to sociology, political science, and history) required.

Research experience and knowledge of current academic research on challenges to democracy, in the United States and/or comparatively, required.

Excellent organizational skills, attention to detail, and a high degree of professionalism.

Excellent interpersonal skills; team player with demonstrated ability to take initiative, work independently, and respond flexibly to changing demands.

Strong writing skills for a range of audiences.

Interest in working in a professional role at the interface between different scholarly communities, and between the academic and philanthropic spheres.

Ability to travel several times a year for events.

The University of Texas at Dallas (UT Dallas) seeks applications and nominations for the position of Dean of the School of Economic, Political and Policy Sciences. The Dean reports to the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost and is delegated primary responsibility of working with the faculty of the school in planning future initiatives, for administering the school's annual budget, for organizing the school's class offerings, and for hiring and evaluating the school's faculty and staff.

The School of Economic, Political and Policy Sciences (EPPS), one of the eight UT Dallas teaching units, is organized into seven academic programs: Criminology and Criminal Justice, Economics, Geospatial Information Sciences, Public and Nonprofit Management, Sociology, Political Science, Public Policy and Political Economy. These programs collectively offer a total of eight undergraduate majors, eleven undergraduate minors, ten masters, and six doctoral degree programs, which play an integral role towards the interdisciplinary mission of the University. The school's faculty include 58 appointments in the tenure system, 11 full-time faculty appointed outside the tenure system, and 13 part-time instructors. EPPS operates on an annual budget of approximately \$11 million.

The University of Texas at Dallas, a component of The University of Texas System, is located at the confluence of the cities of Richardson, Dallas, and Plano. UT Dallas is one of the nation's 131 universities ranked as "R1 - Very High Research Activity" in the Carnegie Classification, and is one of the three Texas universities to have qualified for support from the state's National Research University Fund. Current direct research funding from federal agencies is greater than \$50 million, and the university's endowment is valued at more than \$700 million. Current enrollment exceeds 28,000, with undergraduates comprising 70% of this population. The UT Dallas freshman class has outstanding academic credentials, with the Fall 2018 class including 172 National Merit Scholars.

The individual appointed as dean must have a record of academic and scholarly achievements to qualify for appointment as a tenured professor in the school. Desired attributes include demonstrated ability to provide a distinguished faculty with administrative leadership, the ability to eloquently articulate the missions of higher education in general and of the social sciences in particular to prospective students and university supporters, and the collegiality to work constructively with staff, faculty, and university administration to advance the university's mission. The ideal candidate is sought who has experience building strong community connections and seeking resources to support the mission of EPPS with regards to fundraising to support faculty research, student scholarships, endowments and gifts, and employment opportunities for our students.
