Asking the Right Questions: APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask Program

Asking the right questions provides valuable information for career decisions. As part of the **APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask (JCQ) Program** participating political science departments have agreed to answer the following questions from job candidates.

Salary

1. What is the salary structure?
2. How is salary normally negotiated?
3. How are annual increases handled?
4. Is there an automatic escalator to ensure the salaries of future hires will not outpace those of existing department members?

Service Activities

1. What are the expectations of pre-tenure and tenured faculty regarding:
 - departmental and institutional committee work,
 - professional or disciplinary activities, and
 - outreach activities to communities external to institution?

Research Support

1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - access to research materials and equipment,
 - the employment of research assistants,
 - research expenses on/off campus, and
 - travel expenses for conferences?

2. What departmental or institutional resources are available to seek external funding and to administer external funding awards?

Teaching Support

1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - the development of teaching expertise,
 - innovations in teaching, and
 - the introduction of new courses and new technologies?
2. What are departmental expectations regarding:
 - the average course load,
 - the number of different courses taught by faculty, and
 - advising of graduate and undergraduate students?

Tenure, Renewal, and Annual Review

1. What policies and procedures govern the granting of tenure, renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty, and annual reviews of faculty performance?
2. What are the department's expectations for successful performance leading to the granting of tenure or renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty?
3. What are the department's expectations for a positive annual review?

Mentoring and Faculty Support Initiatives

1. What attention does the department give to integrating new faculty into the department, the institution, and in the profession?
2. Does the department or institution have programs that address:
 - the employment of dual-career professional couples,
 - family needs of faculty and staff, and
 - issues associated with minority faculty and staff?

Health and Life Insurance

1. What are the plans offered?
2. How are benefits disbursed?
3. What are the out-of-pocket expenses?
4. Are partners and/or children covered, and to what extent?
5. What portion of my paycheck will be deducted for these benefits?

Retirement

1. How many types of retirement plans are offered?
2. What is the matching percentage of the institution?
3. Is contribution required (and how much)?

We work hard every day to build the public's trust and confidence in our court system, which includes issues such as bail reform, marijuana decriminalization and recovery court.

Whether it be in a courtroom, an administrative office, a courthouse training room, an IT office or in the field, our Judiciary workforce is improving the lives of countless individuals and families every day. We honor the dignity and individualism of each member of our organization while fostering professionalism and continuous improvement in our work.

The Judiciary offers a strong opportunity for growth.

The New Jersey Judiciary seeks an Administrative Specialist 4 for the Statistics team within the Quantitative Research Unit of the Data Analytics, Research, and Statistics (DARS) office. The selected individual will perform a variety of medium to high-level statistical functions relating to the production and statistical analysis of the official monthly court statistics and ad hoc reports as well as business analysis, project management, and project implementation.

The selected candidate will also assist in modernizing monthly statistical reporting, analyzing statistical trends, and creating and developing interactive dashboards. The individual will use advanced processes in Microsoft Excel, Power BI, and/or statistical analysis software, such as SPSS, to complete these functions as well as create and produce additional reports as needed.

REMOTE WORK: The Judiciary currently offers a hybrid work schedule, and this position may qualify for up to 3 days of remote work outside of Judiciary buildings. To participate in this program,

in addition to installing a multifactor authentication app on your phone or tablet, you will be required to have high speed home internet access.

EXAMPLE OF DUTIES:

- * Creates and analyzes monthly statistical reports, creates and updates Power BI dashboards, and develops and produces new or ad hoc reports, as assigned.
- * Prepares monthly statistical reports, annual statistical reports, and medium-to-high level statistical analyses using Excel, Power BI, SPSS, SQL, SAS, Tableau, Focus/WebFocus or other tools as appropriate.
- * Develops proof of concept methods for displaying and/or visualizing data and assists in communicating requirements and implementing approved visualizations.
- * Provides input into the design of additional data dashboards and other new forms of reporting as they are developed.
- * Work to understand the entire data pipeline, from case counts from the mainframe system, including system and process dependencies to the display of that information in data visualization software.
- * Translates requests for statistics and analyses into appropriate responses that may require business analysis techniques, understanding complex court data, discussion with internal stakeholders, and the extraction of data from systems.
- * Converts complex data into understandable charts, graphs, reports, and statistical presentations.
- * Collaborates with the Information Technology Office and Automated Trial Court Services Unit on plans for data system updates from the data analysis perspective, as needed.
- * Document data analysis and reporting techniques to ensure they can be replicated.
- * Identify and communicate risks of data limitations and recommend improvements to data collection and/or reporting practices.
- * Ensure statistics are relevant to the data story being constructed.
- * Mentor analysts with statistical and data knowledge.
- * Support other units with overlapping interests in data quality, analysis, and reporting.

Note: Experience with advanced Microsoft Excel, including PivotTables and macros, Power BI and intermediate data visualization practices is required. Experience in generating and interpreting Visio documentation is preferred.

Regular and predictable physical presence at the worksite is an essential function of this position.

Salary range is \$76,423.34 - \$113,148.46. For newly hired individuals, the starting salary will normally be at the minimum of the salary range.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Bachelor's degree in Statistics, Criminology, Criminal Justice, Political Science, Psychology, Economics, Data Science or other relevant discipline from an accredited college or university along with five (5) years' of professional experience in program development, program coordination, program analysis, program administration and/or administrative research, three (3) years of which should include experience in data analysis and reporting.

Experience conducting social science research in any social science field is helpful.

Substitution: Applicants who do not possess the required education may substitute additional paraprofessional and/or professional experience on a year-for-year basis with one (1) year of such experience

being equal to 30 semester hour credits. An Associate's degree and two (2) years of additional paraprofessional and/or professional experience may be substituted for a Bachelor's degree. A Master's degree may be substituted for one (1) year of general experience as indicated above. A Ph. D or law degree may be substituted for two (2) years of experience.

This position is responsible for coordinating the Doctor of Science in Public Safety program, as well as ordinary faculty responsibilities of teaching undergraduate and graduate courses, service, and scholarship. It is a 10-month tenure-track or tenured position with faculty rank. Regular on-campus presence in Macon is also required for the position. Rank and academic title will be determined based on qualifications and experience.

The Identity & Conflict Lab (ICL) at Yale University, led by Professor Nicholas Sambanis, seeks to appoint up to two exceptional candidates as Postdoctoral Associates for the 2025-2026 academic year. This opportunity is for a one-year, full-time residential postdoctoral research fellowship, with potential to renew for one year conditional on successful performance. The appointment will begin on July 1, 2025.

Housed in the MacMillan Center for International and Area Studies, the ICL addresses a broad range of critical questions focused on inter-group conflict and identity politics. The ICL analyzes how social identities shape individual behavior, how conflict affects identities, and what interventions are effective in reducing inter-group conflict. Both violent and non-violent forms of conflict are considered, ranging from bias, discrimination, and protest to ethnic violence, secessionism and war.

Postdoctoral associates will work in one of ICL's ongoing projects in the following two thematic areas: (1) measuring norms of good citizenship across countries; (2) conducting experimental interventions to reduce native-immigrant conflict in Europe with a primary focus on Greece; and (3) analyzing sources of the escalation of foreign policy disputes. Postdoctoral associates may also be asked to contribute to

Most of the research currently in progress uses quantitative methods, with an emphasis on experimental methods. The ICL seeks to integrate substantive and methodological knowledge across the social and behavioral sciences to develop new analytical approaches and new insights into these thematic areas with a view to shaping new directions in scholarly literatures as well as influencing policy design.

Postdoctoral associates will be expected to work three days/week on ICL projects under the direction of Professor Nicholas Sambanis and can pursue their own research for the remainder of their work time.

The lab seeks to produce the world-leading academic research and timely policy analysis needed to grapple with geopolitics and political economy of the energy transition. It combines the technical analysis of net-zero supply chains with the study of net-zero industrial policies to catalyze strategic collaborations between government and industry.
