Finding the openings is the easy part; knowing how to approach the application and interview process is a little more challenging. eJobs: This online resource contains comprehensive online listing of political science jobs, is updated daily with new job listings and candidate resumes, and is fully searchable by field of interest, name of employer/candidate, region, keyword, position, salary, type of institution, and most recent posts.

Asking the Right Questions: APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask Program

Asking the right questions provides valuable information for career decisions. As part of the APSA Job Candidate Questions to Ask (JCQ) Program participating political science departments have agreed to answer the following questions from job candidates.

Salary

- 1. What is the salary structure?
- 2. How is salary normally negotiated?
- 3. How are annual increases handled?
- 4. Is there an automatic escalator to ensure the salaries of future hires will not outpace those of existing department members?

Service Activities

- 1. What are the expectations of pre-tenure and tenured faculty regarding:
 - departmental and institutional committee work,
 - professional or disciplinary activities, and
 - outreach activities to communities external to institution?

Research Support

- 1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - access to research materials and equipment,
 - the employment of research assistants,
 - · research expenses on/off campus, and
 - travel expenses for conferences?

2. What departmental or institutional resources are available to seek external funding and to administer external funding awards?

Teaching Support

- 1. What departmental or institutional resources are available to support:
 - the development of teaching expertise,
 - · innovations in teaching, and
 - the introduction of new courses and new technologies?
- 2. What are departmental expectations regarding:
 - the average course load,
 - the number of different courses taught by faculty, and
 - advising of graduate and undergraduate students?

Tenure, Renewal, and Annual Review

- 1. What policies and procedures govern the granting of tenure, renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty, and annual reviews of faculty performance?
- 2. What are the department's expectations for successful performance leading to the granting of tenure or renewal of contracts for pre-tenure faculty?
- 3. What are the department's expectations for a positive annual review?

Mentoring and Faculty Support Initiatives

- 1. What attention does the department give to integrating new faculty into the department, the institution, and in the profession?
- 2. Does the department or institution have programs that address:
 - the employment of dual-career professional couples,
 - family needs of faculty and staff, and
 - issues associated with minority faculty and staff?

Health and Life Insurance

- 1. What are the plans offered?
- 2. How are benefits disbursed?
- 3. What are the out-of-pocket expenses?
- 4. Are partners and/or children covered, and to what extent?
- 5. What portion of my paycheck will be deducted for these benefits?

Retirement

- 1. How many types of retirement plans are offered?
- 2. What is the matching percentage of the institution?
- 3. Is contribution required (and how much)?

Rank: Postdoctoral Researcher Position in Business Power, Wage Inequality, and Climate Change Regulation, Department of Sociology/Political Science, University of Copenhagen

The Employment Relations Research Centre (FAOS) at the Department of Sociology, University of Copenhagen, invites applications for a fixed-term postdoctoral researcher position (2 years) starting 1 October 2025, or as soon as possible thereafter.

This position is part of the BIZPOWER (Business Power in the Politics of Wage Inequality and Climate Change) project, which investigates how businesses use self-regulation (S-R) to influence public policy and preempt statutory regulation. The postdoctoral researcher will primarily contribute to Work Package 2 (WP2) and Work Package 3 (WP3), which focus on comparative case studies of how businesses engage in regulatory strategies in Denmark and Germany. The postdoctoral research will focus mainly on Germany.

The project is led by Associate Professor Christian Lyhne Ibsen (PI) and is funded by the Independent Research Fund Denmark. The research team consists of another postdoctoral researcher who will conduct survey experiments (WP1) and the PI.

Job Description

In a context of multiple global crises—COVID-19, increased inequality, and climate change—citizens are looking to political leaders and the state to solve problems and protect them. The increased role of the state might fundamentally change the conditions under which business operates around the world.

This project investigates how business actors manage the regulatory challenge in two of the most pressing structural transformations in the 21st century – the rising inequality and climate change. It poses the following research question: Under what conditions can business be powerful in the high-salience politics of wage inequality and carbon emissions?

Specifically, the postdoctoral researcher will investigate how businesses in Denmark and Germany have historically influenced wage policies and climate regulations through self-regulation, lobbying, and coalition-building.

Kev Tasks:

Conduct comparative case studies of business self-regulation in wage policy (WP2) and climate policy (WP3) in Germany.

Utilize process-tracing methodologies to analyze how business actors attempt to influence policymaking and public opinion.

Gather and analyze archival data, media sources, policy documents, and corporate reports to reconstruct historical decision-making processes.

Conduct and analyze elite interviews with business leaders, policymakers, trade unions, and onvironmental organizations.

Compare cross-national and cross-policy variations in how businesses preempt regulatory challenges.

Write academic articles based on findings for submission to top political science and sociology journals.

Present findings at international conferences (e.g., APSA, EPSA, SASE, CES).

This position is ideal for a researcher with a strong background in comparative political economy, business-government relations, and regulatory politics.

The postdoctoral researcher position is a full-time research position and does not involve any teaching obligations.

Qualifications

We seek candidates with the following qualifications:

A PhD in Political Science, Sociology, Political History, or a related field (completed or near completion).

Expertise in qualitative research methods, particularly process-tracing, elite interviews, and comparative case study analysis.

Strong knowledge of business power, regulatory governance, and political economy.

Experience working with policy documents, archival research, and media analysis.

Ability to conduct interviews with high-level stakeholders (e.g., business associations, policymakers, trade unions, and NGOs).

Fluency in German and English is required; proficiency in Danish is desirable but not a requirement.

Work Environment & Research Team

The postdoctoral researcher will work closely with Associate Professor Christian Lyhne Ibsen, another postdoc and an international advisory board, including leading scholars from Harvard University, MIT, Boston University, University of Konstanz, and Stanford University.

The University of Copenhagen provides a dynamic interdisciplinary research environment, offering access to state-of-the-art research infrastructure for qualitative and comparative political research.

The project will provide opportunities for collaboration on high-impact publications, networking with leading experts in business power and public policy, and participation in international research events.

China and the World Program (C&WP)

Professors Thomas J. Christensen of Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs and Alastair Iain Johnston of Harvard University's Government Department jointly founded the China and the World fellowship program for the advanced study of China's international relations in 2005. As part of Professor Christensen's recent move to Columbia University, the Program was renamed the Columbia-Harvard China and the World Program (C&WP) in 2018. The China and the World Program supports research that integrates theoretical innovations in the field of international relations with the rigorous study of China's interactions with countries, regions, institutions, and non-state actors.

For academic year 2026-2027, C&WP plans to award 2 postdoctoral research fellowships. Both fellows will be in residence at Columbia University and will teach one course in the Fall or Spring semester. Housed in the MacMillan Center for International and Area Studies, the ICL addresses a broad range of critical questions focused on intergroup conflict and identity politics. This fellowship is uniquely situated at the intersection of academic and public-facing scholarship, allowing the fellow to pursue a multitude of career paths, contribute to research that directly affects important issues in American politics, and increase visibility of their research.

The Weidenbaum Center at Washington University in St. Louis invites applications from recent Ph.D. graduates for a one-year post-doctoral fellowship. The fellowship will run for 12 months, starting on or around July 1, 2025, with the possibility of a one-year renewal.

The Weidenbaum Center has supported survey data collection efforts through The American Panel Survey (TAPS), The American Social Survey (TASS), and the Weidenbaum Center Survey (WCS). The Center's most recent efforts have focused on the launch of the WCS, which is fielded three times each year, includes a sample of 3,000 respondents (2,000 general US adult population and oversample of 1,000 African Americans), with each survey paired with voter file data and web-tracking data for a subset of respondents. The Fellow will work collaboratively with Taylor Carlson, graduate student fellows, and other Weidenbaum Center affiliates to support the launch of the Weidenbaum Center Survey and other data collection efforts through the Center. The Fellow will assist with the launch of an online dashboard that allows people to analyze and download the survey data, write public-facing reports describing key findings from the data, draft survey instruments, create publicly available data repositories, and conduct both coauthored and independent academic research.

We are seeking an individual with social science research interests who will advance the Center's mission by engaging in collaborative and independent research and who will enjoy the opportunity to contribute to public scholarship (blog posts, reports, website graphics). We are especially interested in candidates with training in survey methodology and experience with public-facing scholarship (e.g., opeds). Candidates should detail their experience in these areas in their cover letters and showcase any of these interests in the writing sample. We anticipate that the Fellow will spend most of their time working on Center-related and coauthored projects with Taylor Carlson and other Center affiliates.

Given that AIS is a new department, initially, all faculty members are expected to fully engage and participate in the building of a new department including but not limited to

Developing a vision for the department that encompasses its role in enhancing training opportunities and engaging communities around issues related to AI and society,

Developing department policies and procedures,

Creating undergraduate and graduate programs, including developing and implementing new courses, in the department.

In the steady state, successful candidates will be expected to teach courses at the graduate and undergraduate levels, mentor graduate students, advise students at all levels, and maintain an active research program. McGill University's Department of Political Science is seeking applicants for a nomination to a Canada Excellence Research Chair (CERC) in the area of Computational Social Science, AI, and Democracy. The CERC program supports Canadian universities in their efforts to build on Canada's growing reputation as a global leader in research and innovation. The program supports world-renowned researchers and their teams to establish ambitious research programs at Canadian universities. These awards are among the most prestigious and generous available globally.

Following a highly competitive and rigorous selection process involving peer review, CERCs are appointed for a period of eight years in values of \$8 million or \$4 million (over the entire award period). Ideally, the candidate has expertise and interest in innovative research using computational methods such as machine learning (ML), natural language processing (NLP), multi-modal large language model algorithms (LLMs), network analysis, and/or data mining to study the influence of digital media and AI technologies on democratic engagement and governance, for example on fair elections, social mobilization, and the spread of uncivil discourse and information manipulation. The candidate could contribute to the theorizing on the ethical and political implications of AI technologies, for example involving transparency, democratic accountability, and the protection of democratic values. Ideally, the selected candidate runs a lab or research group affiliated with the chair. The Chairholder may serve as the focal point between the Centre for the Study of Democratic Citizenship (CSDC), the Centre for Media, Technology and Democracy, and the Media Ecosystem Observatory, at McGill University.

In a context of multiple global crises—COVID-19, increased inequality, and climate change—citizens are looking to political leaders and the state to solve problems and protect them. The increased role of the state might fundamentally change the conditions under which business operates around the world.

This project investigates how business actors manage the regulatory challenge in two of the most pressing structural transformations in the 21st century – the rising inequality and climate change. It poses the following research question: Under what conditions can business be powerful in the high-salience politics of wage inequality and carbon emissions?

The postdoctoral researcher will be responsible for designing, implementing, and analyzing survey experiments that assess how business self-regulation influences public opinion on wage inequality and carbon emissions regulation.

Key tasks:

Designing survey experiments that test whether S-R affects public support for stricter government regulation.

Developing experimental treatments.

Managing data collection in collaboration with survey providers in Denmark and Germany.

Analyzing survey data using quantitative methods such as conjoint analysis, regression modeling, and causal inference techniques.

Writing academic articles based on the survey findings for submission to top sociology/political science journals.

Presenting research findings at international conferences (e.g., APSA, EPSA, SASE, CES).

This position is ideal for a researcher with a strong background in survey methodology, experimental design, and statistical analysis who is interested in business power, self-regulation, and public opinion in policymaking.
